What happens to a child when his/her parent is incarcerated?



Emotional trauma

Loneliness/anxiety
Anger towards
criminal justice system¹



Education cessation
Multiple school transitions
Dropout¹



Economic hardship

Difficulty to retain accommodation Poor healthcare¹

He/she becomes a victim of crime and punishment²



In five years,


total grants disbursed were 412.


Because it excludes, children...

Whose sole bread-winning parent has been incarcerated


Whose parents have lived in Delhi for 2 or 3 or 4 years

Who avail financial assistance or benefits under any other government scheme, ex, disability pension program




Key recommendations: Eligibility




Key recommendations: Quantum of Financial Assistance




